

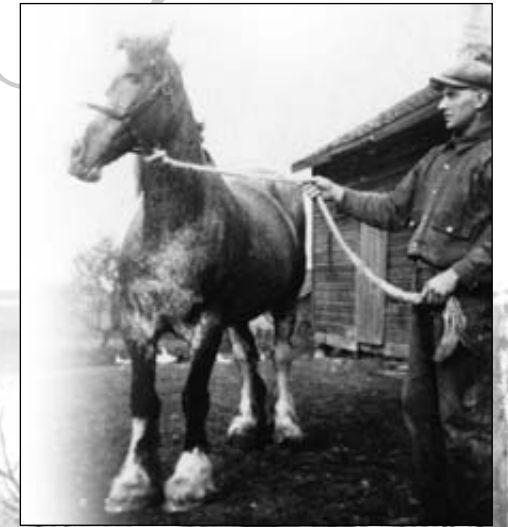

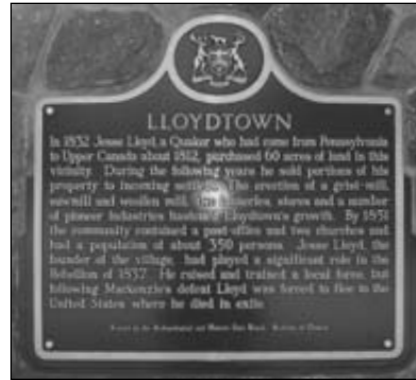

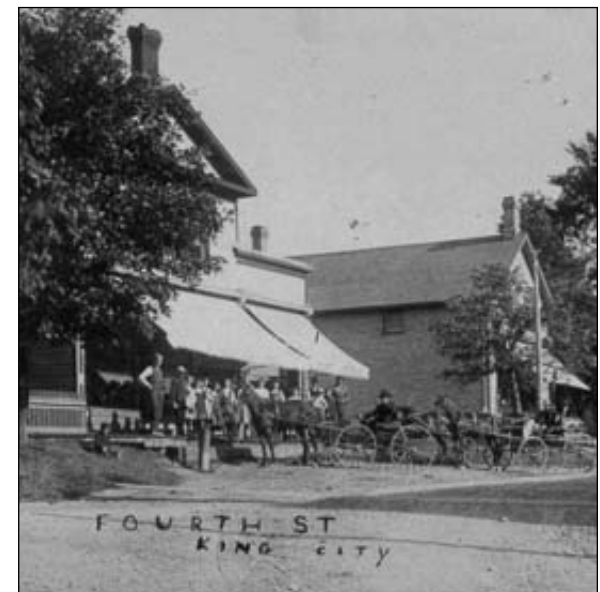

PRESERVATION

KING RAILWAY STATION

The oldest extant station in Canada has been moved to the Museum grounds and restored.

KING CHRISTIAN CHURCH

Rescued from rot and disuse, now stands on the Museum grounds and is used for special events.

LLOYDTOWN PIONEER CEMETERY

With a grant from the federal Millenium Fund and public fundraising, restoration was completed in 2000.
